

We need time to help us refresh ourselves in the unchanging truth of who God is – "*you alone are God over all the* ______ *of the earth. You have* ______ *heaven and earth*" (2 Kings 19:15 NIV).

We need space to renew our faith toward our faithful God – "*I am not* _____, *for my Father is with me*" (John 16:32 NIV).

We need space to help us restore what has been depleted – "*In* ______ *I will lie down and sleep, for you alone, LORD, make me dwell in* ______" (Psalm 4:8 NIV).

We need the grace to remember that we need help – "*The work is too*______for you; you cannot handle it ______" (Exodus 18:18b NIV).

And how does one find the time and space and grace to be completely with God – all of who we are and what want – if we refuse to "*stop*" with our ... Agendas? Schedules? Plans? Purposes? Schemes?

So, today, let us choose to "*stop*". Let us make a purposed choice to be with God. Let us make a purposed choice to be for God.

Let us pause our pursuits and "*stop striving*" so we ... Sit with God. Talk with God. Enjoy God.





"He says, '_____ still, and know that I am God ... " (Psalm 46:10a NIV, ESV, NLT).

To "be" is "to occupy a place or position²."

God invites us to create a space for Him so that place and that position becomes one of faith and trust: gínomai (ghin'-om-ahee)³.

To become. To be made. To receive into being. To continue. To follow. To grow.

More like Him. Closer to Him. A better reflection of Him.

Want to become more like Christ? "Be."

Want to be made more into the image of Christ? "Be."

Want to continue to grow (in) your faith? "Be."

Want to be a better follower and servant? "Be."

Want to continue to learn to love well? "Be."

God calls to "be" with Him – on purpose to revitalize His influence over us and reinvest His presence with us – so we can "become" like Him. Because we were created by Him to become like Him.

"As God's chosen people, ______ and dearly loved" (Colossians 3:12 NIV), there are things that "be" should produce in our lives.





"Our God says, '_____ down, and learn that I am God! ... " (Psalm 46:10a CEV).

I find as I get older it gets easier to be râphâh (raw-faw') – idle, slacking, relaxed, withdrawn, still, letting go⁵.

It is easier to sit. It is easier to stay. It is easier to "*stop striving [let go, relax]*" (NASB).

It is easier to "be."

I still have to remind my mind over and over again that it is a good thing to stop trying so hard and to let go every once in a while. It may not understand "*that's enough*!" (CEB), whether calmly spoken or harshly commanded, until all the warning sensors are going off. It may not be willing to "*stand silent*!" (LB) while trying to find or create the answers to all the questions.

But God is always right there, reminding me to "stop fighting" (GNT).

Because we refuse to râphâh (raw-faw') ... That is us thinking we are better and smarter than God. That is us trying to control the situation to the outcome we have deemed best. That is us wanting all of the power ... and potentially the glory ... for ourselves and on us.

And ultimately, when we insist on running our own lives without God's input or direction, that is us telling God that He and His grace are <u>NOT</u> good enough. Yes, our need to control puts us in the center of everything instead of God, and we basically tell God to go sit quietly in the corner until we absolutely need Him.

Is this what God wants for us? Is this God's best for us?

Or might râphâh (raw-faw') be a better option? Could râphâh (raw-faw') be the place where, in pausing and praying, we find the strength, the guidance, the clarity, and the hope that we are (desperately) searching for?

Râphâh (raw-faw') is an invitation to allow God to be God in your life. Full control for Him. Full submission for you. Will you send Him your "yes" response to His invitation?



"That's _____! Now know that I am God! ... " (Psalm 46:10a CEB).

We all have those moments when we reach the end of our patience.

We all come to the point where we are challenged beyond our abilities by ... "A furious squall" (Mark 4:37 NIV). "A terrible storm" (TLB). "A fierce gale of wind" (NASB).

Something mégas (meg'-as) ⁶ .
Great.
Large.
Loud.
Mighty.
Intense.

And as we feel more overwhelmed, we become desperate in trying to save ourselves from feelings of "*about to sink*" (Mark 4:37 CEV, TLB). Inadequacy. Incompetence. Insecurity.

We become so focused on ourselves that our senses tune out all the love and grace and compassion being offered to us by our loving Savior.

He is encouraging our heart, our mind, our emotions, and our words to $si\bar{o}pa\bar{o}$ (see-o-pah'-o) – hush, hold its peace, be calm, be quiet⁷.

"[Jesus] got up, rebuked the wind and said to the waves, '_____! Be still!"" (Mark 4:39 NIV).

Stop negotiating. Stop rationalizing. Stop excusing.

Tell yourself "*that*'s enough!" and start choosing to trust God.



God says slow down and stop striving. You cannot be fully present with God when you are allowing the pressures, the pain, and the problems to distract you.

When Jesus came, He also told us to slow down and stop striving. He repeated what His Father had been saying. He said ménō (men'-o)¹⁰.

Abide. Continue.

Dwell.

Endure.

Remain.

Stand with.

Be held.

Wait for.

Five times in several sentences Jesus tells us to ménō (men'-o). To wait for God. To continue trusting in God. To continue walking with God. To remain sure that God is with you. To be held by God's grace. To "dwell in the shelter of the Most High" (Psalm 91:1 NIV).

Ménō (men'-o). Stay expectant that God is moving you toward a new level of faith, hope, and love.







Be + still.

David explains why this is important in Psalm 23. "The LORD is my shepherd" (1a).

God is our râ'âh (raw-aw') – companion, (special) friend, herdsman, pastor, tender, teacher¹³.

He is a caring and compassionate leader who does not want us to châçêr (khaw-sare') – fail, want, lessen, lack, be without¹⁴ – anything we absolutely need.

As our râ'âh (raw-aw'), God needs us to rest and relax ... to stop and be still ... so we can be prepared for the trials, tests, and temptations that will come.

So, He nâhal (naw-hal') – protects, sustains, carries, guides, leads¹⁵ – us with complete care and concern for our well-being.

Because he wants us to râbats (raw-bats') – recline, repose, fall down, rest, sit, stretch out, lie down¹⁶ – within His mercy and grace.

Because without râbats (raw-bats'), we miss the m^enûwchâh (men-oo-khaw') – peaceful, consoling, comforting, easing, quiet, restful, still¹⁷ – power of His presence.

We miss the possibilities of new He offers ("green pastures") to spur us on to the next step, the next grace, the next blessing, the next miracle, the next level.

Without râbats (raw-bats'), we miss the tsedeq (tseh'-dek) – right, just, righteous, prosperous¹⁸ – hope of His presence.

We miss "*the paths of righteousness*" that lead us to His best life for us ... and help us to become the best versions of ourselves.

Without râbats (raw-bats'), we miss the nâcham (naw-kham') – consolation, comfort, ease, repentance, compassion¹⁹ – of having God <u>always</u> with us and for us.

We miss ...

The "*table*" of fellowship offering us to take what God has made available. The "*goodness*" of God helping us to overcome with His presence and power. The "*mercy*" of never giving up on us as we figure things out.

Be + still reminds that we serve a God of ALWAYS.

God is always ready to refresh. God is always ready to renew. God is always ready to restore. God is always ready to rejuvenate.

God is always ready to provide what we need to fulfill His purposes. God is always ready to protect as He walks beside us. God is always ready to equip us for victory over the enemy.

God is always ready to invite us ... To sit and be with Him. To draw near to Him. To *"be still"* with Him.

So, we can yâshab (yaw-shab') – sit down, dwell, remain, settle, abide, establish, stay²⁰ – with God and live life <u>His</u> way ... and find our best life day after day.

<u>Or</u>

We can yashab (yaw-shab') with our abilities and power ... and always come up lacking and lackluster and uninspired.

Going with God will get us where we need to be. Going with God will create the space for grace.

But going with God will require us to râbats (raw-bats') and yâshab (yaw-shab') so we can be fully connected and firmly invested in what <u>He</u> wants to do.







It is interesting that the NIV tells us who is speaking before telling us who He is – "He says."

Very few translations add this detail. The only other one I found is "Our God says" (CEV).

It is important to know who is speaking, so you know how important the words being spoken are. Don't we pay more attention to the red letters in the New Testament? And shouldn't we? Because red letters mean Jesus is speaking, telling us who God is and who we are in God.

Just as God spoke the world into creation. "*And / Then God said* …" (Genesis 1:3, 6, 9, 11, 14, 20, 24, 26, 29). God said something, creating the outline. And then God said again, filling the outline. Example: "*Let there be light*" becomes day and night, sun and moon.

When Jesus came, John tells us that "the ______ became flesh and made His dwelling among us. We have seen His ______, the glory of the one and only ______, who came from the Father, full of grace and ______" (John 1:14 NIV).

Everything 'ĕlôhîym (el-o-heem')²¹. The exceeding God. The mighty God. The supreme God. The one true God.

Everything life-giving. Everything life-changing.

Everything we need to live our best life with eternal joy and hope. Everything we need to experience "*the* _______ *of God, which transcends all understanding*" (Philippians 4:7 NIV). Everything we need to create compassion and emote empathy for our fellow man.

Everything good. Everything holy. Everything righteous.

That is "I am God."



Why is it important to "*stand silent*" (aka "*be still*")? God tells us.

So, we can yâda' (yaw-dah')²². Know. Learn. See. Perceive. Discern. Distinguish. Recognize. Admit. Comprehend. Acknowledge. Confess. Declare. Be sure. Understand. But to yâda' (yaw-dah') what?

But to yâda' (yaw-dah') what? 'ělôhîym (el-o-heem')²³. The one true God.

To yâda' (yaw-dah') that God is for you. To yâda' (yaw-dah') that God is with you. To yâda' (yaw-dah') that God wants good things for you.

To yâda' (yaw-dah') that the best thing we can "do" is to "be" – to be constantly looking and desiring and praying to discern and declare God.

To yâda' (yaw-dah') that God is working in you, for you, and through you with the intercession of the Son and the instruction of the Spirit.

To yâda' (yaw-dah') that God wants you to leave anything less than His best and abandon anything that does not produce His good fruit in your life.







"Be _____, be _____, see, and understand that I am the _____ God" (Psalm 46:10a VOICE).

Let me ask you a question – if you never stop to "*be still*" or "*be calm*" with God, how can you … Hear God's voice? Know God's presence? Live God's truth?

It is a BIG overall question, but I think this is what the psalmist is telling us. You want to know God? You want to know what God wants? You want to know what God thinks? You want to know what God feels?

Be + still = know.

Be + still is the way we connect with ... God's presence. God's Spirit. God's guidance. God's truth. God's grace. God's peace. God's contentment.

And it is in the purposeful connecting with God that we come to know ... Who God is. Who we are in God. Who we can be with God's help.

We come to know ... and believe "God is our ______ and strength, an everpresent ______ in trouble" (Psalm 46:1 NIV).

God is our safe place, our machăçeh (makh-as-eh') – shelter, hope, refuge, trust²⁴. God is our power, our 'ôz (oze) – security, boldness, might, strength²⁵. God is our 'ezrâh (ez-raw') – helper, assistance²⁶. God is the reason we keep getting up and we keep going forward ... because we

trust there is something better waiting for us and someone better walking with us through all the tsârâh (tsaw-raw') – adversity, affliction, anguish, distress, trouble²⁷.

We come to know ... and believe "God is within her, she will not ______" (Psalm 46:5a NIV).

God is with us – walking behind, beside, and before ... as we need His support and encouragement. We may be tempted to môwt (mote) – waver, slip, shake, fall, slide, totter, dislodge, drop²⁸ – in our faith, but we will not stay that way. We will not slide into disbelief. We will not slip into discontent. We will not be shaken into disobedience.

We come to know ... and believe "the LORD Almighty is with us" (Psalm 46:7a, 11a).

No matter what.

He will be faithful to keep His promises that "*I* will never leave you nor forsake you" (Joshua 1:5b NIV) and "*The LORD himself goes before you and will be with you*; he will never leave you nor forsake you" (Deuteronomy 31:8 NIV).

He will be faithful to keep Paul's promises that we can experience "how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ" (Ephesians 3:18 NIV) and "[nothing] will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:39 NIV).

How much more do we need when we <u>always</u> have the Creator and Curator of the world with us?

Be + still gives us the space for grace to "*come and* ______ *what the LORD has done*" (Psalm 46:8a). To châzâh (khaw-zaw' it) – see, behold, perceive, look, gaze²⁹. To know it. To appreciate it. To grow because of it.

Be + still allows us to focus on Him and give Him the rûwm (room) – raising, uplifting, exalting, magnifying³⁰ – praise, worship, adoration, and affection He is due (Psalm 46:10 NIV).





God says "stop."

Stop doing. Stop trying. Stop striving. Stop controlling.

"Step out of the traffic" (MSG) of trying to be your own master, your own source, your own god.

Let go. Let go of doing ... what seems right to you. Let go of trying ... to make people like you. Let go of striving ... to manipulate things your way. Let go of controlling ... things toward your preferred outcomes.

Step back. Step down.

Step out of God's way. Stop being so self-reliant and self-righteous. Stop ignoring God.

Be + still. Learn to trust. Learn to lean in. Learn to lean on.



Them is us. Them is You!

And the truth is that God will day after day, moment after moment, and situation after situation offer us His loving, life-giving yâțab (yaw-tab') – sweetness, acceptance, benefit, contentment, favor, goodness, gladness³¹.

"Be still" is God's nice way of saying "Stop! That is enough!" (2 Samuel 24:16; 1 Chronicles 21:15 NLT).

Stop trying to run your life, run the world, and run (over) people – it is <u>not</u> your job, and you will never be smart enough or qualified enough to do it with the same grace as God.



your High God " (Psalm 46:10a MSG).			

You stand at the crossroad, having to decide what you will do. You look both ways and consider your options.

To the left: Fear. Worry. Doubt.

You can insist on doing things your way and living life by your perspective. But how far can you really see? How confident do you really feel? Are all the possibilities absolutely clear?

To the right: God. Peace. Guidance.

The space for grace to live in the humility of "*Our Father in heaven*, ______ *be Your name, Your kingdom come, Your ______ be done, on earth as it is in heaven*" (Matthew 6:9-10 NIV).

God, Your thélēma (thel'-ay-mah) – desire, pleasure, will, purpose, choice, determination, inclination³³ – before mine.

God, Your basileía (bas-il-i'-ah) – rule, kingdom, power, dominion, reign, kingship³⁴ – instead of mine.

Because You have always been, are, and will always be hagiáz \overline{o} (hag-ee-ad'-zo) – holy, sacred, pure³⁵. Even when ... and especially when ... we are not.

Do you want to experience the fullness of God's goodness and grace? Go God's way.



"Step out of the ______! Take a long, ______ look at me, your High God ... " (Psalm 46:10a MSG).

Let us pause for a minute and consider the crossroads. It is "a crucial point, especially where a decision must be made³⁶."

There is a verse from the prophet Jeremiah where God is speaking to rebellious and defiant Israel, asking them to consider ... and change ... their ways back to faith in Him.

"This is what the LORD says: 'Stand at the crossroads and look; ______ for the ancient paths, ask where the ______ way is, and walk in it, and you will find ______ for your souls " (Jeremiah 6:16 NIV).

He reminds them they ' \hat{a} mad (aw-mad') – establish, set, maintain, appoint, ordain³⁷ – their direction by the derek (deh'-rek) – road, way, path³⁸ – they choose.

This derek (deh'-rek) will determine ... The course of their days. The habits of their daily doings. The manner of their faith. The fiber of their moral character.

This derek (deh'-rek) is translated "crossroads" in every translation.

And it is vital in this place of decision that we make good choices. We must know "the good way" (CEB). We must know "the good road" (ERV). We must know "the best road" (GNT). We must know "the right route" (MSG).

We must know God's ṭôwb (tobe) ³⁹ way.
Best.
Good.
Gracious.
Kind.
Loving.
Excellent.
Prosperous.

Happy. Right. Favored. Cheerful.

Because it is the only way to find God's râga' (raw-gah')⁴⁰. Settled. Quiet. Ease. Rest. Repose.

"A resting place for yourselves" (CEB). "You will find peace" (CEV). "Rest for yourselves" (ERV). "You will live in peace" (GNT). "A resting place for your souls" (NASB). "Rest for your souls" (NLT).

But how can we find God's best and beautiful way if we refuse to "be still"?

Because "be still" allows us to hear and sense and see God. Because "be still" allows us to choose well.

And Jeremiah 6:16 reminds us that the choice is always ours.

We choose whether we will yâlak (yaw-lak') – walk, come, flow, go, follow, move, $proceed^{41}$ – with God ... or away from God.

We choose whether we will take the nâthîyb (naw-theeb') – beaten track, trodden path, travelled way⁴² – toward God ... or go our own way.

We choose whether we will allow the 'ôwlâm (o-lawm') – eternal, everlasting, perpetual, without end, continuous, forever, infinite⁴³ – things of God to direct our lives ... or our self-righteous sense of right and wrong.





"Be still and know (recognize, _____) that I am God ... " (Psalm 46:10a AMP).

"Be still" helps us to remember that our choices have consequences – good choices bring good consequences, and bad choices bring hard consequences.

God may be merciful in not allowing us to feel the full weight of our choices, but there are still repercussions to <u>every</u> decision we make.

And God knows that most of the time we will be tempted to do things ... Against God's will. Away from God's peace.

So, He gives us the loving reminder to "*be still*" to help guide us to good choices, wise decisions, and peaceful preferences.

Be still and "*do not be* ______ *in your own eyes*" (Proverbs 3:7a NIV) as you think, speak, act, react, and do. Do not think you are more châkâm (khaw-kawm') – wise, intelligent, skillful, shrewd, learned⁴⁵ – than the Creator and Curator of the universe.

Remember that "*the way of* _______ *seems right to them*" (Proverbs 12:15 NIV). Thinking we know better than God makes us 'ĕvîyl (ev-eel') – perverse, silly, foolish, quarrelsome, mocking⁴⁶.

It puts us in direct ... Contention with the grace of God. Conflict with the goodness of God. Controversy with the generosity of God.

It keeps us from ... Living life God's way. Loving people by God's will. Choosing things God wants.

It produces consequences and births regrets ... possibly disastrous and serious.



"That's ! Now know that I am God ..." (Psalm 46:10a CEB).

Choices are seeds, and God teaches us in Genesis 8:22 that seed will always produce – "*As long as the earth endures, seedtime and* ______, *cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never* ______" (NIV).

Where there is seed, there will never shabath (shaw-bath') – cease, fail, lack⁴⁷ – a harvest.

But the harvest will always depend on the seed. The seed you sow produces the harvest you reap. The choices you make determine the consequences you face.

And Jesus teaches us in Matthew 13 that seed ... our choices ... always produces in several possible ways.

Option #1: "some [seed] fell along the path, and the _____ came and ate it up" (Matthew 13:4 NIV).

Sometimes we are careless. Sometimes we do not think about how we are hurting ourselves ... and others. We let things $p(pt\bar{o} (pip'-to) - fail, fall away, be thrust, be lost, be removed⁴⁸ - from what we know is right just to feel comfortable or accepted, just to shut down the voices of wisdom speaking to us, or just to experience the much longed-for moment of peace.$

We try to live life trusting God and allowing Him to change us for the better. In what we say. In what we do. In what we think. In what we feel.

But the hodós (hod-os') – progress, journey, way, course, manner⁴⁹ – rarely proves to be ... Easy. Convenient. Comfortable. Painless.

Because we have an enemy watching us and waiting for any opportunity to harpázō (har-pad'- zo) – pluck, pull, take, seize, carry away, snatch⁵⁰ – anything good and faithful and trusting in us.

Looking for any circumstance where he can get you to question ... The grace of God. The goodness of God. The generosity of God.

Because he wants to katesthíō (kat-es-thee'-o) – devour, consume, squander, waste⁵¹ – our faith. To separate us from God.

So we challenge God's grace. So we doubt God's goodness. So we question God's generosity.

And he will use whatever he can to accomplish this mission.
Our own emotions ... chaotic and uncontrollable.
Our own guilt ... crashing and unending.
Our own pain ... crushing and unhealing.
Others' opinion ... caustic and unhelpful.
Others' judgment ... critical and unsupportive.
Others' disapproval ... contemptuous and unhealthy.

There may be some glimmer of truth in how he comes for us ... but ultimately he twists that little bit of truth into complete deception and deceit and lies.

He will use whatever people, situations, and methods he can to make sure we stay away from God ... and keep widening that distance.

Because if we ever truly syníēmi (soon-ee'-ay-me) – comprehend, put together, understand, perceive, set our mind, be wise to⁵² – who God is and who we are in Him, we would be ... UNSTOPPABLE. UNTOUCHABLE. INCONVINCIBLE. UNINFLUENCED. UNMOVABLE. UNFLINCHING.

"Be still" helps us syníēmi (soon-ee'-ay-me) the grace of God and allow it to guide us to stay on God's hodós (hod-os') and find our best life ... and our best love.

"Stop striving [_____] and know that I am God ... " (Psalm 46:10a NASB).

Choices are seeds, and God teaches us in Genesis 8:22 that seed will always produce – "*As long as the earth endures, seedtime and* ______, *cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never* ______" (NIV).

Where there is seed, there will never shabath (shaw-bath') – cease, fail, lack⁵³ – a harvest.

But the harvest will always depend on the seed. The seed you sow produces the harvest you reap. The choices you make determine the consequences you face.

And Jesus teaches us in Matthew 13 that seed ... our choices ... always produces in several possible ways.

Do you feel kaumatízō (kow-mat-id'-zo) – burned, scorched, tortured⁵⁶? Are you so busy saying "yes" to make other people happy or like you that you never take time to take care of yourself and relax?

Do you feel xēraínō (xay-rah'-ee-no) – dried up, withering away, wasting away, shriveling⁵⁷? Are you so weighted down by the opinions and expectations of others they try to (viciously) wrap around you that you feel stuck and/or frustrated?

Do you feel skandalízō (skan-dal-id'-zo) – displeased, offended, distrusting, indignant⁵⁸? Are you so overwhelmed focusing on the bad things and convinced of the terrible possibilities in every situation that you feel hopeless?

Do you feel the only rhíza (hrid'-zah) – root, spouting, offshoot⁵⁹ – in your life is ... Despair? Desperation? Desolation? Destruction? Rejection? Rebuke? Refusal? Rebellion? Negativity? Cynicism? Distrust? Melancholy?

There is chará (khar-ah') – joy, gladness, calm delight, joyfulness⁶⁰ – to be had.

In choosing to sow seed in any of the above ways, we are going to miss the chará (khar-ah').

Your life is your gē (ghay) – country, earth, ground, land, territory region⁶¹ – where your faith is planted, cared for, and harvested.

Plowing into the thlîpsis (thlip'-sis) – affliction, anguish, burden, trouble, tribulation, pressure, distress, oppression⁶² – instead of over it and through it leads to a life of ... Regret. Remorse. Rage.

But allowing "be still" to guide your hand, heart, and head toward the bathos (bath'-os) – the depth and deep things of God⁶³ – will produce ... A glorified harvest. The hope of change. Boldness.

"Be still" provides a divine opportunity to grow that root in the good soil of God's love and grace.



Where there is seed, there will never shabath (shaw-bath') – cease, fail, $lack^{64}$ – a harvest.

But the harvest will always depend on the seed. The seed you sow produces the harvest you reap. The choices you make determine the consequences you face.

And Jesus teaches us in Matthew 13 that seed ... our choices ... always produces in several possible ways.

Option #3: "*Other seed fell among*_____, *which grew up and*_____, *which grew up and*_____, *the plants*" (Matthew 13:7 NIV).

We all understand Paul's feeling of pain regarding "*a thorn in my flesh*" (2 Corinthians 12:7 NIV) that plagued and persecuted him. He begged for relief and pleaded for release, but God said no.

God told Paul "*My power is made perfect*" (2 Corinthians 12:9 NIV) as you experience this skólops (skol'-ops) – prickle, disability, annoyance, stake, splinter⁶⁵.

But let's be honest. How often does our pain feel purposed? How many times has our grief felt glory filled? How regularly does our desolation feel divine?

Sometimes it is our choices that bring the ákantha (ak'-an-thah) – thorns, brambles, briers⁶⁶ … That torture. That poke. That distress. That agonize. That suffer.

And sometimes it is the choices and opinions and expectations of others.

No matter the source of pain, it will always anabaínō (an-ab-ah'-ee-no) – arise, climb, grow, come up, spring up⁶⁷ – in our lives.

Its mission is to apopnígō (ap-op-nee'-go) – choke, stifle, suffocate, drown⁶⁸ – us. Its mastery is to sympnígō (soom-pnee'-go) – strangle, drown, choke, suffocate⁶⁹ – us.

To turn the ... Calm into chaos. Still into stress. Blessing into burden. Obedience into obligation. Love into liability. Generosity into greed. Helpful into hoarding. Divine into distress. Strength into insecurity. Truth into trouble.

It wants to turn everything good into mérimna (mer'-im-nah) – cares, anxieties⁷⁰. The weight of opinions. The drain of approval. The worry of control.

To overwhelm us. To overpower us. To overthrow us.

To convince us the apátē (ap-at'-ay) – delusions, deceits⁷¹ – are real and our faith is wasted.

"Be still" is God's invitation to take all these negative things and give them fully to the loving Father who created you and cares for you in ways you cannot even imagine.

"Be still" allows us to stop being persuaded, controlled, and manipulated by things that are not of God, from God, and for God.

How does "be still" help us to overcome the compressing crush of mérimna (mer'-im-nah) and focus on the compassion and help of God?


Go Deeper:

Just when it seems to feel hopeless, that we have no options for a better life, a happier future, or a peaceful mind, Jesus shines the light of heaven.

Jesus puts a divine spotlight on the kalós (kal-os')⁷³ that is God. Beauty. Virtue. Fairness. Goodness. Honesty. Excellence. Admirable. Precious. Magnificence.

Praiseworthy. Noble. Honorable. Comforting.

All these different facets of the goodness of God.

Available to us. Without limit. Without hesitation. Without prejudice.

Because God wants to produce His karpós (kar-pos') – fruit, posterity, effect, result, deeds⁷⁴. In us. Through us. For us.

He wants us to become ... Agents of change. Ambassadors of compassion. Allocators of care.

He does not want us to get overcome by the things that want us to be ... Dumbfounded. Distracted. Disturbed.

He wants us to face all these things with the faith that comes by synfemi (soon-ee'-ay-mee) – comprehension, understanding, wisdom, perception, knowledge⁷⁵ – of knowing God IS who He says He is.

"*Be still*" invites us to know with our heart that "*He is the faithful God*" (Deuteronomy 7:9, Psalm 31:5 NIV), no matter how circumstances beg us to believe otherwise.

"Be still" invites us to submit to the life-changing belief that "He is the Rock, his works are perfect, and all his ways are just. A faithful God who does no wrong, upright and just is He" (Deuteronomy 32:4 NIV) ... and to live our life best serving and submitting to such a loving Father.



"Stop striving [let go] and ______ that I am God ... " (Psalm 46:10a NASB).

We have looked at how the seed (choice) determines the harvest (consequence) ... and how Jesus shows us what to watch for, be wary of, and withdraw ourselves from if we want to experience the wisdom, growth, and joy that comes from a well-planted seed.

Now I hope we can take a few minutes to consider that is not just WHAT we speiro (spi'-ro) – scatter, sow, plant⁷⁶ – that matters.

It is important HOW we sow.

Because how we sow (decide) is affected by what we yâda' (yaw-dah') – know, perceive, comprehend, understand, admit, recognize⁷⁷ ... About ourselves. About others. About God.

Most importantly, we have to decide in ways that ... Honor God. Submit to God. Trust God.

When we yâda' (yaw-dah') that God is "*Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace*" (Isaiah 9:6 NIV) – that there is no other like Him, that He wants good things for us, that He cannot be contained by time or space, that He is the standard of excellence and soundness – we plant with a life-changing, heart-turning, eye-opening faith.

And such faith, when renewed decision by decision and strengthened good seed by good seed, allows us to be the child of God who is ...

Metamorphóō (met-am-or-fo'-o). Transformed, changed, transfigured⁷⁸. From the inside out. At the heart of who we are.

Anakaínōsis (an-ak-ah'-ee-no-sis). Renovated, renewed, completely changed for the better⁷⁹. By the loving Father who created us to be redeemed by the Savior Son and guided by the supportive Spirit into the best and most grace-filled life possible.

Ready to seek and search out the agathós (ag-ath-os') – good, pleasant, agreeable, joyful, happy, excellent, distinguished, useful, upright⁸⁰ – things of God in our everyday lives.

Willing to choose the hard thing (later) over the easy way (now) to find the euárestos (yoo-ar'es-tos) – agreeable, acceptable, well-pleasing⁸¹ – will of God for ourselves and to offer His grace to others.

Able to humble ourselves and submit our will to embrace the téleios (tel'-i-os) – completeness, perfection, maturity⁸² – that comes from allowing God to be in (complete) control.

"Therefore, I urge you, brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy, to ______ your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God—this is your true and proper worship. ² Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be ______ by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's ______ is—his good, pleasing and perfect will" (Romans 12:1-2 NIV).

It is important what we are willing to parístēmi (par-is'-tay-mee)⁸³. Commend. Give. Present. Show. Yield. Offer. Provide. Bring near.

"Be still" reminds us to parístēmi (par-is'-tay-mee) to God ... All that we are. All that we have been. All that we hope to be.

"*Be still*" reminds us to allow God to be in control of every part of us, to give God complete access to what we say, do, think, and feel.

So, "*let us not become weary in doing good*" (Galatians 6:9 NIV), having faith, and choosing the things of God.





Wouldn't it be nice if our lives were more like our childhood cartoons and God had the cartoontype arrow pointing at ...

The things He has for us.

The people He wants us to know.

The places He wants us to go.

Wouldn't it be easier to decipher "*whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable … excellent or praiseworthy*" (Philippians 4:8 NIV) if God made it …

Obvious? Clear? Blatant? Bright? Known?

But He does not. Instead, He gives us the freewill to ... Choose Him. Consider Him. Follow Him.

He gives us the option to ... Challenge what we think. Contradict what we know. Cancel what we want.



"*Be still*" and accept God's grace so "*you'll learn to live freely and lightly*", full of the grace and truth needed to feel peace, joy, contentment, and forgiveness.





"Stand ______! Know that I am ______." (Psalm 46:10a TLB).

We have thought and felt our way through "*be still*" and its implications to us. What does it mean? What does it mean for me?

And I keep feeling God say: Stop. Slow down. Pause. Relax.

Stop trying to control everyone and everything around you.

You <u>cannot</u> manage people's image or expectation of you. You <u>cannot</u> dictate what people think of you. You <u>cannot</u> change people's feelings toward you. You <u>cannot</u> manipulate people's reaction to you.

You <u>cannot</u> control every situation of your day. You <u>cannot</u> decide everything wisely on your own. You <u>cannot</u> think the best of things through the chaos of your emotions.

You <u>cannot</u> be all things to all people AND still be all that God created you to be.

But you CAN ... Lean into God. Trust God. Choose to follow God.

Because "He is most careful with you" (1 Peter 5:7 MSG).

He is mélō (mel'-o)⁹⁶. Interested in us. Concerned about us. Careful toward us.

And He asks us to ... Believe this as truth. Lean into this truth.

Live this truth.

And to be purposeful in how we epirrhíptō (ep-ir-hrip'-to)⁹⁷. Cast our concern. Throw our troubles. Place our pain.

Peter reminds us that we have to CHOOSE ... In God's direction. For God's purposes. Because of God's love.

That means we have to be tapeinóō (tap-i-no'-o)⁹⁸. Humble. Make low. Reduce. Assign.

Everything we have been – our past. Everything we are – our present. Everything we hope to be – our future.

Our hearts. Our minds. Our bodies.

To God's will. To God's ways. To God's wants.

And we cannot do it with Christ.

So, "be still" and allow God to hupsŏō (hoop-so'-o) – raise you to the dignity, honor, and happiness⁹⁹ – He instilled in every fiber of your being and every piece of your purpose.

"Be still" and willing give it all to God. It will change your life and your future for the better.



Be Still: Bonus

"Give ye ______, and see ye, that I am God ... " (Psalm 46:10a WYC).

"God is not human, that he should ______" (Numbers 23:19 NIV). "God, who does not _____" (Titus 1:2 NIV). "It is impossible for God to _____" (Hebrews 6:18 NIV).

God cannot kâzab (kaw-zab')¹⁰⁰. Fail. Lie. Deceive. Be a liar.

God will not pseúdomai (psyoo'-dom-ahee)¹⁰¹. Speak deliberate falsehoods. Utter an untruth. Deceive by a lie. Lie to.

When God makes a promise, He keeps it. "*Not one of all the LORD's good promises to Israel failed; every one was fulfilled*" (Joshua 21:45 NIV). There is <u>never</u> any naphal (naw-fal') – failure, rotting, desertion, falling short, dropping¹⁰² – when God promises.

When God makes a promise, He aligns the people, places, and circumstances needed to fulfill it. *"For no word from God will ever fail"* (Luke 1:37 NIV). There is nothing adýnatos (ad-oo'-nat-os) – impossible, unable, impotent, weak, powerless, disabled¹⁰³ – about God that He cannot and will not honor His word.

"Be still" allows us to open every part of ourselves to the truth of God. "Be still" allows us to acknowledge the faithfulness He has continually shown us. "Be still" allows us to adjust our attitudes and mindsets to what God says is right.

"Be still" allows us to stop lying to ourselves and begin to change for God purposes into the person He created us to be.
